Additionally, he has served staff positions with US Strategic Command, European Command as Chief of the Office of Defense Cooperation, Bucharest, Romania and Assistant Chief of Staff, Requirements, NAEW&C Force Headquarters, SHAPE, Mons, Belgium.

In 1994, he obtained a Master's Degree in Aeronautical Science from the Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, which compliments his practical experience in the fields of Aircraft System Management, Programme Management, Business Process Management, general management and leadership.
