

The Multinational Multi-Role Tanker Transport Fleet

The Multinational MRTT Fleet (MMF) stands out as a unique example of effective cooperation between NATO and the European Union in delivering critical capabilities. Initiated by the European Defence Agency (EDA) as an initiative to address the long-standing shortfall in European air-to-air refueling capacity in 2012, the MMF has grown to a mature programme, that provides its six participating nations (Belgium, Czech Republic, Germany, Luxembourg, The Netherlands and Norway) with air-to-air refueling, air transport and strategic medical evacuation capabilities.

The fleet is owned by NATO and managed by the NATO Support and Procurement Agency (NSPA). The fleet is operated by the Multinational MRTT Unit (MMU), from the Main Operating Base in Eindhoven (The Netherlands) and the Forward Operating Base in Cologne (Germany).

10 MRTT aircraft have been ordered to date. 7 aircraft have been delivered to the Multinational MRTT Unit (MMU) between 2020-2022. Two aircraft (8 and 9) will be delivered in 2024 and aircraft 10 is planned for 2026.

NSPA is the lead organisation for multinational acquisition, support and sustainment to NATO, its 31 Nations and Partners.

The MMF is based on a pooling and sharing concept, laid down in a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) where participating nations get access to state-of-the-art aircraft by a multinational cost-sharing arrangement.

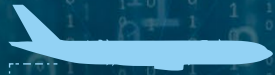

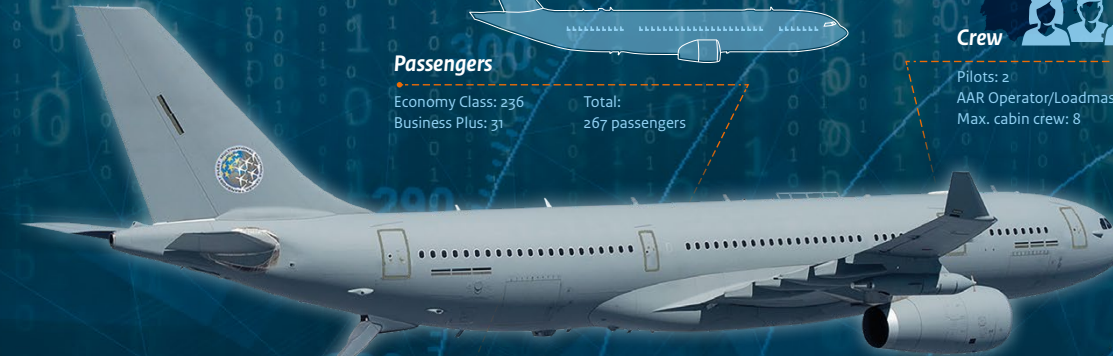

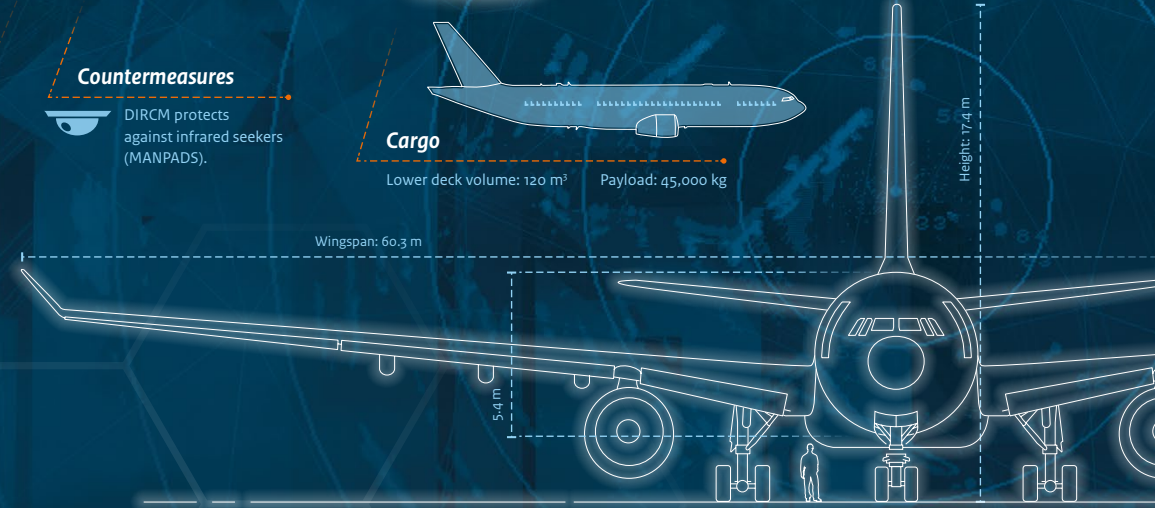
